Whidbey and Camano Islands provide visitors both a physical and mental makeover from mainland to island, transporting travelers to a slower pace. The islands offer a wide variety of lodging options. Dine nightly on fresh food harvested that day from local farms or surrounding waters. Enjoy craft beverages at coffee roasters, distilleries, breweries, wineries, cideries and even a meadery. Don't miss the great gray whale migration each spring through Saratoga Passage, between the two islands.

CAMANO ISLAND

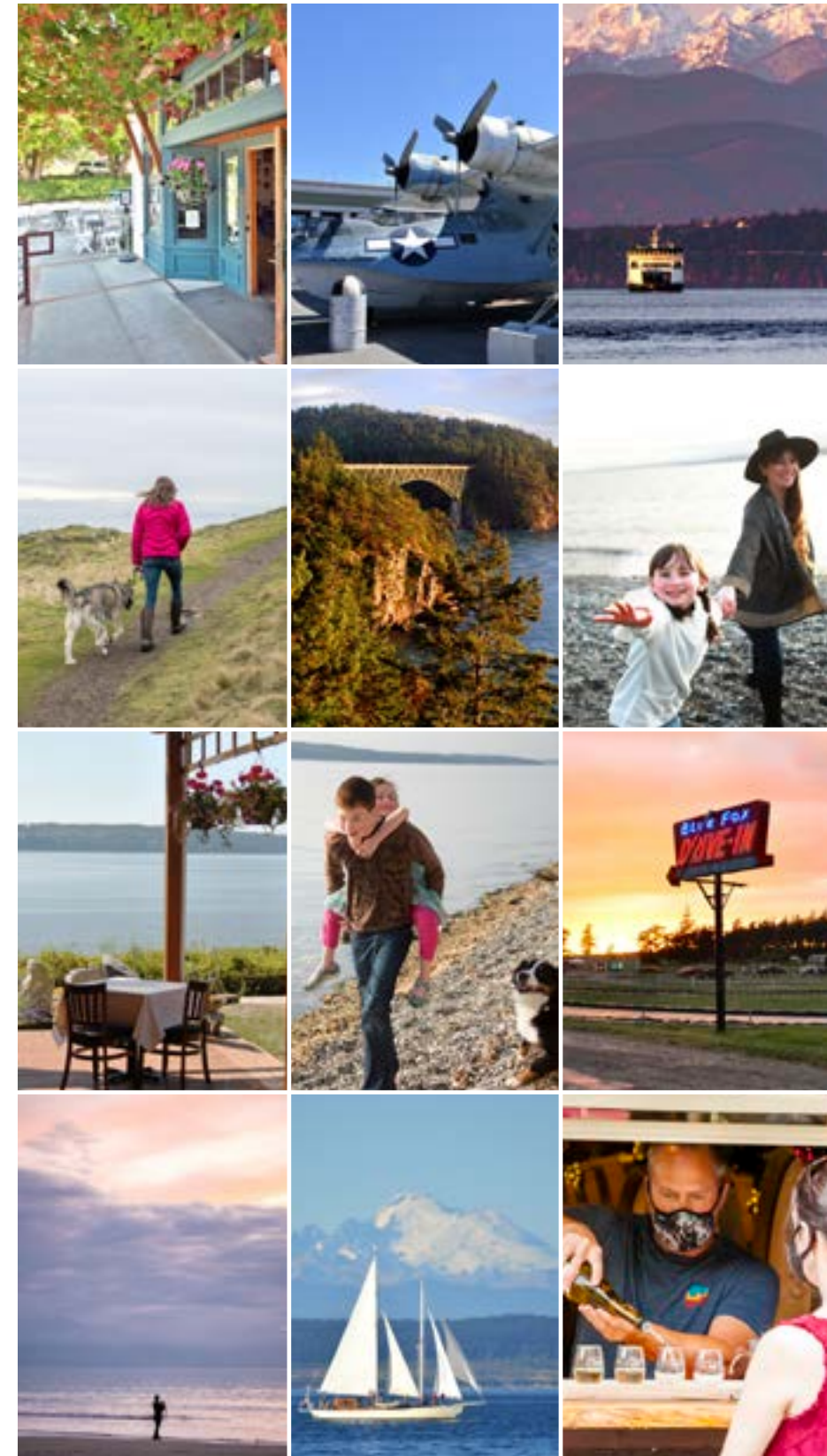
Laid back and friendly, it's known for ziplining, axe throwing, Dungeness crab, a prolific arts community and natural beauty. The roads create an uncomplicated driving loop for exploring uncrowded beaches, parks and winding forested trails. There's abundant lodging, some at the water's edge, for beach walking or whale watching from the shore.

WHIDBEY ISLAND

The dramatic beauty of Deception Pass is a memorable way to arrive or depart. Or choose from two ferry routes. The island is the perfect balance of nature, the arts, and small-town vibe. You may even spy "Top Gun" pilots from the Naval Air Station training overhead. Surrounded by snow-capped mountains, the main road is appropriately named the Whidbey Scenic Isle Way. Lodging is abundant and ranges from rustic to luxury.

In the Embrace of the Salish Sea

The waters surrounding Whidbey and Camano Islands have always been an essential part of life for residents. The earliest Coast Salish peoples relied on the bountiful sea for food and transportation. Much later, European settlers would depend on the same things, although canoes eventually gave way to ferries. The two islands of our county haven't been connected by ferry service since the construction of **Deception Pass Bridge** in the 1930s, but it is still the embrace of the Salish Sea that ties our islands together.

Although we no longer *need* to pull our food from the waves, there is nothing quite like freshly-caught seafood. This area is famous as one of the best places in North America to fish right off the beach for salmon, and several of the bigger lakes are stocked with trout or largemouth bass, best caught in the spring or fall. Check on the **Shellfish Resource** page of Island County's website for the best clamming and crabbing beaches, dependent on the tides. For a fishing license and any gear you may need, swing by **Jim's Hardware** in Clinton (for complete list see page 7).

If you love seafood but prefer it already caught and prepared, **Seabolt's Smokehouse** in Oak Harbor has you covered, with fresh takeout and

lovely gifts. **Saltwater Seafood and Oyster House** in Langley offers a delicious menu and new pop-up **Salt & Sea Provisions** for you to stock your cupboards at home. Enjoy some famous **Penn Cove Mussels** right on the shores of their namesake at the **Captain Whidbey Inn**. This historic landmark has been refreshed and updated, while maintaining its character and continuing to bring locals together for events and fun.

LIFE'S A BEACH

Every islander has a favorite beach, and there is no shortage of new ones to explore. **Windjammer Park** in Oak Harbor has many special features, including over 2,000 feet of waterfront trails, perfect for pushing a stroller or wheelchair. The vast **Fort Casey State Park** stretches well over 400 acres and offers a dose of military history along with stunning views of the **Strait of Juan de Fuca**. Overnight lodging is available at the **Fort Casey Inn**, within WWI-era officers' housing.

You'll barely have to leave the water's edge for a fresh and delicious takeout meal from **Cama Beach Café**, perched just above the fascinating **Center for Wooden Boats**. From here you can rent a vessel and enjoy this coastal resort that's attracted families for close to a hundred years. Secure yourself a cabin through **Cama Beach State Park** if you aren't ready to go home yet.

Our furry family members may love the beach best of all, making **Double Bluff Beach** in Freeland a popular choice for an off-leash destination. To avoid bringing the beach home with you, stop in at **The Healthy Pet** nearby and take advantage of their self-service dog wash station. Or pick up a ball chucker at **Whidbey Natural Pet** in Coupeville or **Island Pet** in Oak Harbor, sure to tire Fido out. If you'd like to make a weekend of it, there are several dog friendly inns available. Freeland's **Harbor Inn**, the **Best Western** in Oak Harbor, and the **Coupeville Inn** are all happy to host pets.

ON THE WATER

Kayakers the world over are drawn to our incredible shorelines. You can rent a kayak at **Penn Cove Outfitters** on the historic wharf in Coupeville. **Whidbey Island Kayaking** at **South Whidbey Harbor** offers rentals, instruction, and guided tours. They also host a guided beach walk, where you may learn something new about the shores you've been walking for years! Right next door is the **Boatyard Inn**, with spectacular studio rooms overlooking the Sound and southern tip of Camano Island.

If you'd like to get on the water but not under your own steam, there are wonderful boat tours available on both islands. Take a scenic cruise or go on a crabbing adventure

with **Boats Afloat 2** on Camano Island; explore the thrilling waters under the iconic bridge, or go whale watching with **Deception Pass Tours**. Skimboarding and Kiteboarding are two more attractive ways to enjoy our beaches and shores.

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From Island Soil to Island Tables

Agriculture has a long and celebrated history here. Both islands can boast fourth generation farmers, still working land claims that have been in their families since the mid to late 1800s. This ancient tradition is complemented by a new wave of young farmers wanting to live closer to the Earth, resulting in a vibrant agri-culinary industry that provides incredible local food to islanders and well beyond.

Farmers continue to be stewards for the land, leading the way on sustainable practices so that future generations may be fed from the same plot. Near Coupeville, the **Pacific Rim Institute for Environmental Stewardship** is furthering that mission, giving people and communities the tools to care sustainably for the land. For those who weren't born to farming, it's not too late to learn.

The **Organic Farm School** in Clinton trains a new generation of green-minded farmers, imparting the many skills necessary to tend the land successfully.

Whidbey Island Grown Cooperative brings together farmers and products from up and down the island. By pulling together, growers can purchase supplies more affordably. The organization hosts a fantastic series of events each year for **Whidbey Island Grown Week**, and all year round you can shop local produce online or subscribe to a regular CSA box (Community Supported Agriculture). In early October check out Langley's annual **Harvest Festival**, an agricultural celebration featuring island restaurants for tasting events. Enjoy local foods and wines, take a class, or peruse the arts and crafts stalls.

TRADITION OF SMALL ISLAND FARMS

Though large corporate agri-business is much more the norm today, on Whidbey and Camano Islands we still maintain a wonderful tradition of small farms. It's not uncommon for a farmer to also be an artist or a yoga instructor, and many of these small farms offer a diversity of products and experiences. You might buy teas, soap, or natural sunscreen from **Ananda Farm** on Camano Island; just as you may order a wedding bouquet from **Salty Acres Farms**, near Oak Harbor or **Flying Bear Farm** in Langley.

Some of the oldest structures on all of Camano Island are at **Kristoferson Farm**, yet it's still a working farm and still in the hands of a Kristoferson. This hub of the community hosts special events and sells local produce and homemade products at their special farm stand. Don't forget to stop by **Island Harvest Farm** on Camano Island too, with a huge variety of fresh vegetables

available. These farm stands dot each island and have a lot of character and charm. Also, visit **Lavender Wind** in Coupeville for plants, tasty treats and a selection of lavender products from the farm.

Perhaps your own version of farming doesn't go beyond the window box, but there are many island nurseries to support your efforts great or small. Crossing under the famed laburnum arbor at **Bayview Farm and Garden**, you'll find home and garden wares, a plant nursery, gift shop, and café. In Oak Harbor, check out **Mailliard's Landing Nursery** for all your landscaping needs, including a licensed compost facility to recycle your yard waste for a small fee. At the **Venture Out** plant nursery near Langley, you'll see landscaping techniques brought to life throughout their beautiful, mature grounds.

HOMEGROWN BEVERAGES

Another farm favorite is the huge variety of libations made right here on the islands. Wineries abound, with tempting tastings and gorgeous event spaces. **Whidbey Island Winery** is the oldest on Whidbey Island, and sits right at the entrance to Langley. Not far away is the **Whidbey Island Distillery**, whose delicious range of berry liqueurs harken back to that agricultural history again, when **Greenbank Farm** was once the biggest producer of loganberries in the country. **Edward Lynne Cellars** on Camano Island is open to the public the first weekend of every month and frequently for special events.

Keep an eye on the new cider trend sweeping the islands! **Driftwood Hard Cider** relies on apples from an 100-year-old orchard near Freeland for their tasty line of beverages. **Misfit Island Cider** has a new production space in Langley; you can book a tasting or get a growler filled. **Camano Cider** prides itself on being high quality and hyper local; look for it on tap at locations across Camano Island and beyond.

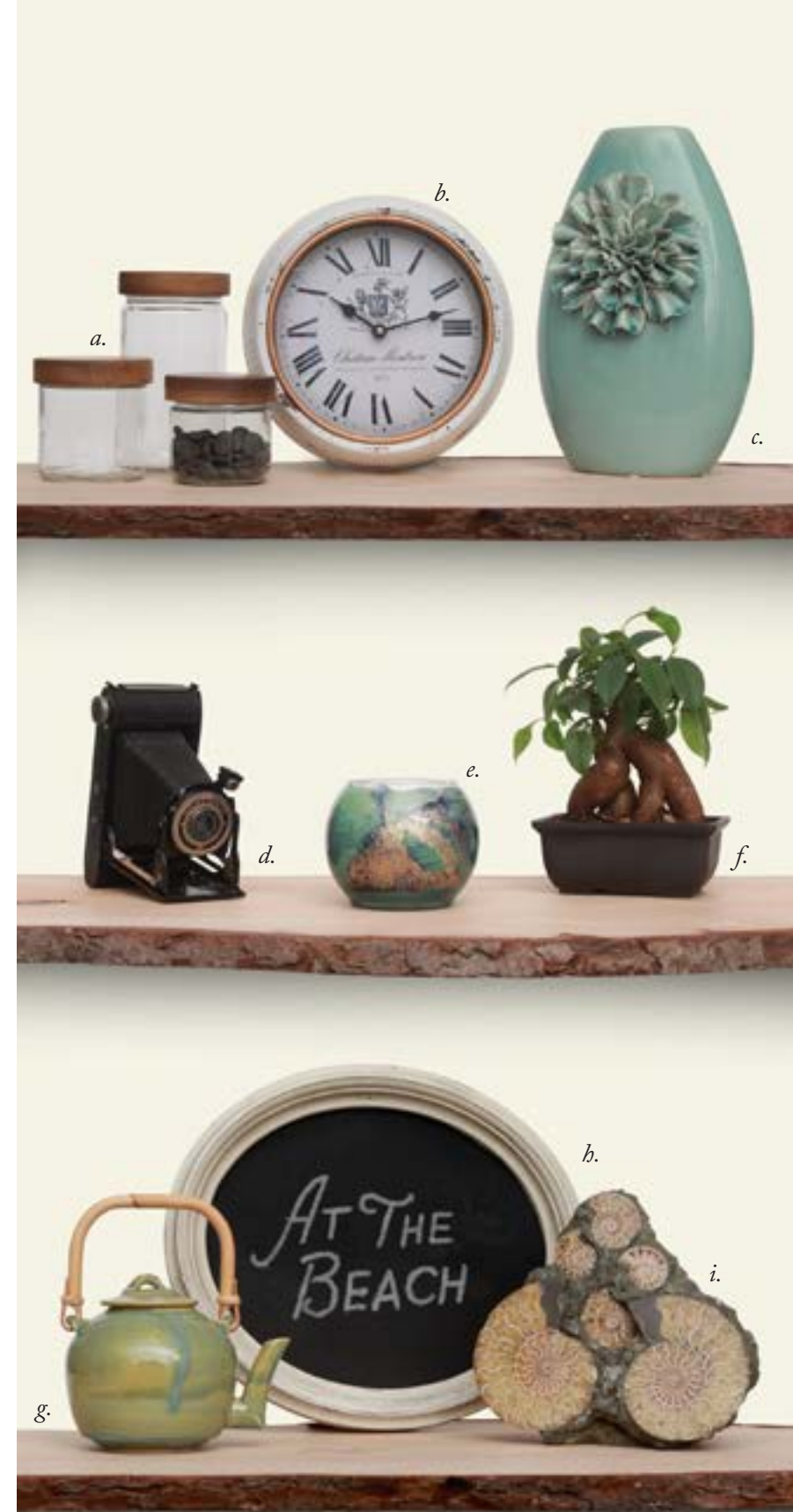

Hands at Work

It's hardly surprising that Whidbey and Camano Islands have long been a haven for artists. The natural beauty and laidback island lifestyle are excellent building blocks for inspiration. Find everyone from award-winning screenwriters to casual weekend potters; from renowned sculptors to amateur watercolorists, and everything in between. Hence the flourishing arts councils on both islands, and the huge number of art events in a typical year.

One popular way to see art, and meet the creators behind it, is the annual **Studio Tour**. Artists of all stripes open their studios to the public, for a peek behind the curtain at their creative process. On Camano Island this takes place over Mother's Day weekend and the following weekend; on Whidbey Island the event is for one weekend in August. It's become so popular, both islands usually have close to 40 locations to explore, and the opportunity to purchase artworks for your own creative sanctum.

ART IS EVERYWHERE

There's no need to wait for a particular weekend to enjoy art. We're surrounded by art every day. A great option to keep you outside is a visit to one of many sculpture gardens, blending human art with Mother Nature's. On Camano Island you can experience **Matzke Fine Art and Design Sculpture Garden**. On Whidbey Island, check out Langley's **Schouten Gallery and Sculpture Garden**, or **Earth Sanctuary and Cloudstone**, both near Freeland. The newest addition is the **Price Sculpture Forest** near Coupeville.

To make an evening of it, stop in at **Blooms Winery and Bistro** in Freeland, where you can enjoy the art gallery, a glass of local wine, and maybe some live music. Check out the **First Saturday Art Walk** each month in Langley from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. Explore local galleries and meet featured artists. Many galleries use this event to kick off new shows. Some serve complimentary wine and hors d'oeuvres, or feature live music. For a rotating variety of art shows and events, keep an eye on the website of **Whidbey Allied Artists**. This local non-profit collective started in the 1950s, and describe themselves as a "floating gallery."

Another staple on the arts calendar is the **Coupeville Arts and Crafts Festival**. A summertime tradition going back nearly 60 years, this event brings people to the historic waterfront for art, music, and culinary creations. For the children in your life, order an eco-friendly art activity box from **Outside The Box Creation**, new every month and delivered right to your door!

ARTISTS SEEKING ARTISTS

Coupeville is home to the **Pacific Northwest Art School**, where working artists share their knowledge with students of all levels across many mediums. Classes and workshops are also available with nationally recognized instructors at the **Whidbey Island Fine Art Studio** in Langley; or venture again to Coupeville to learn the wet-on-wet painting technique made famous by Bob Ross. After just four hours with **Bobbi Bradley** - a certified Bob Ross instructor - you'll be painting happy little trees like a pro.

Or perhaps your inner artist is seeking solitude? To escape the hectic pace of life and plan your own mini retreat in nature, consider **Four Springs House** on Camano Island, an event center at the heart of a gorgeous 50-acre nature preserve. Or **Camp Casey Conference Center** on central Whidbey Island, where history and nature collide in a breathtaking setting. For a truly relaxing retreat, take advantage of Camp Casey's catering options, available for pickup or delivery. Other inspirational places to stay include **Camano Island Inn** right on the water, **Country Cottages** within easy walking distance of all Langley's downtown attractions, or **Wildwood Farm B&B** near Oak Harbor, where gardens and horseback riding are right at your door.

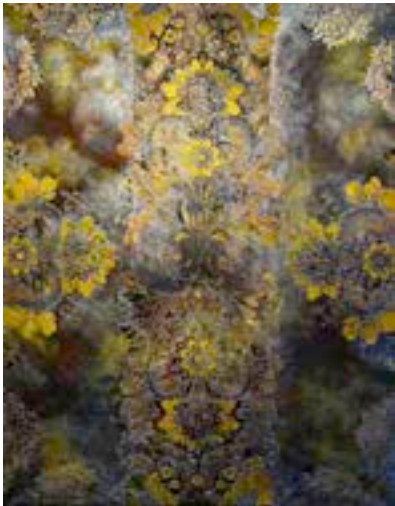

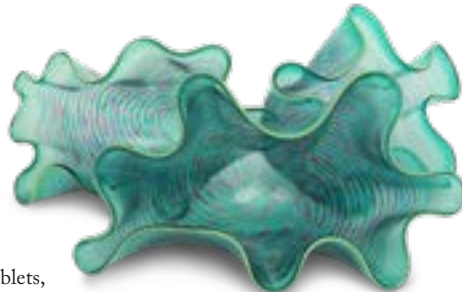

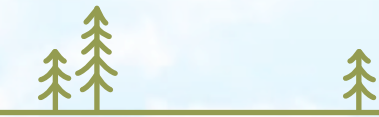
WALKING IN NATURE

Whidbey and Camano Islands have an abundance of beautiful walking trails, often maintained by devoted volunteers. Clinton’s serene **Whidbey Institute** has a 106-acre trail network that’s open to the public from dawn to dusk every day; bikes, horses, and dogs should be left at home. Take your canine companion on-leash through the woodland trails between Maxwelton and Langley Roads. These **South Whidbey Parks and Rec** trails will lead you to **Community Park**, affectionately known as “Castle Park” for its fabulous playground. Your children

will surely love a visit to the 12,000 square foot playground at **Freedom Park** on Camano Island. Another excellent choice for trails, playground and sports fields is **Fort Nugent Park** in Oak Harbor set on 40 acres just behind the downtown area.

If hiking is too unstructured for you, try one of our many picturesque golf courses, such as **Gallery** near **NAS Whidbey**. Even if you’ve never played, it’s hard not to enjoy a stroll over manicured lawns with views of the water. Oak Harbor is home to the **Whidbey Golf Club**, a semi-private course with public tee times available. Check out the pro shops at **Holmes Harbor Golf Course** in Freeland or **Useless Bay Country Club** in Langley, to equip you with everything you’ll need. **Camaloch Golf Course** on Camano Island also has a pro shop, plus the onsite **Rockaway Bar and Grill**.

Our long, scenic, winding roads just beg to be explored, and bicycles are a great way to get out there. A wonderful map is available on the Island County website, outlining the best routes on each island and warning where the shoulders are narrower. Visit the **Skagit Cycle Center** in Oak Harbor or **Bayview Bicycles** at Bayview Corner to find what you need.

Try **Coupeville Health and Fitness** or **Vibrant Fitness** in Langley, for a personal trainer to set you on the right track. **Nutritionist Lori Taylor** in Coupeville can guide you with a plan, and the **Island Athletic Club** in Freeland has a swimming pool to help you get your strength up. Oak Harbor has **Planet Fitness** if you want to work out at your own pace.

Yoga and Pilates are popular choices, with many teachers and studios available to help you advance your practice. The **Pilates Collective** has locations in Langley, Freeland, and Oak Harbor. Try **Movement Arts** on Camano Island for yoga, or **Chrysalis Yoga Shala** in Oak Harbor. You’ll also find the **Lotus Tea Bar and Studio** there for some healthy eats before or after class.

Camano Island is relaxing and friendly and easy to get to by bridge 24/7. No surprise the island's nickname is "*The Easy Island*."

"Just a Splash from Deception Pass," **Oak Harbor** was named after Garry Oak trees. Find them in the historic downtown on Pioneer Way.

The waterfront's historic wharf sits on the shores of Penn Cove in the heart of **Coupeville**, named after sea captain Thomas Coupe.

Greenbank Farm near **Greenbank** is Whidbey Island's narrowest point.

The tagline for **Freeland** is "*Growing a Vibrant and Strong Business Community*," earning its place as South Whidbey's commercial hub.

The mercantile and community gathering place at **Bayview** includes the historic Cash Store.

Langley is called the "*Village by the Sea*" and one of just a handful of Washington state certified creative districts.

"Where your Greatest Adventures Begin" is the perfect tagline for the gateway community of **Clinton**.
